As in the past, we are collecting donations of underwear, sweatpants and shirts, toiletries, and other items to give to the Louis A. Johnson Veterans Administration Hospital here in Clarksburg. Louis A. Johnson, former Secretary of Defense, was a resident of Clarksburg and a member of our parish.

The VA Volunteer Services Office says underpants, undershirts, sweatpants, and sweatshirts have been especially needed in the past. All sizes from medium to 2XXL are accepted and packages of three are preferred, but not required. Of special need are TRAVEL-sized toiletries, such as shampoo, body wash, deodorant, toothpaste and other toiletries in the travel size and ALCOHOL-free (anything containing alcohol will be discarded). If you would like to make a monetary donation, make a check out to Christ Episcopal Church with a notation of VA Donation.

Donations can be dropped off at Sunday services, or at the Parish House during the week (call ahead of time if you need somebody to admit you to the building.)

REQUIREMENTS FOR THOSE NOMINATED

Nomination of Vestry Persons:

Those eligible to be nominated for election to the vestry: All baptized persons who have attained the age of 18 years, and who for the six (6) months last past have been regular worshippers in the Parish or Organized Mission and regular contributors to its support, either by subscription, or by some method by which they shall be known to the Treasurer of the Vestry, and relied upon as such. (Canon 13, Section 4)

Nomination of Diocesan Convention Delegates:

Those eligible to be nominated for election: They shall be any laypersons who are eighteen years of age or older and communicants in good standing of the Parish or Mission. (Canon 3, Section 1)

*These persons should be able to attend quarterly meetings of the deanery (Sundays from 2:30-5:00 pm) in various locations around the Deanery (from Glenville to Kingwood) and should also be able to attend the Diocesan Convention.

Holding on to Hope: A National Service for Healing and Wholeness

On the eve of a historic election and in the midst of pandemic and racial reckoning, **Presiding Bishop Michael Curry will call Americans together for a live-streamed prayer service from Washington National Cathedral.** The *Holding on to Hope* service will be held on All Saints Sunday, November 1, at 4:00-5:30 pm EST, and viewers can join in a variety of ways.

Using a combination of live and pre-recorded elements gathered from across the nation, the service will feature an ecumenical and multifaith array of voices, musical offerings, and prayers designed to help the nation to confess, grieve, and hope as one. In addition to Bishop Curry's sermon, the service will also include reflections from Father James Martin, a noted Roman Catholic author and commentator on American life and values; and Valarie Kaur, an inspiring Sikh filmmaker, author, and civil rights attorney.

"We hope people everywhere will light a candle and join us in prayer at this urgent moment in our national life," Bishop Curry said. "As people of faith, we believe in the power of prayer and the power of God's love to heal a nation and change this world."

- María del Mar Muñoz-Visoso, executive director of the Secretariat for Cultural Diversity in the Church of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops
- Dr. Tarunjit Singh Butalia, trustee of the Sikh Council for Interfaith Relations and Council of the Parliament of the World's Religions

The gathering will be officiated by Washington's Bishop Mariann Edgar Budde, Cathedral Dean Randy Hollerith, and Reverend Stephanie Spellers, canon to the presiding bishop for evangelism, reconciliation and creation.
