Guidelines for In-person Services

1. Wearing a face mask is REQUIRED, unless medically unable to do so, then alternatively, a face shield is required. (Masks will be available at the entrance.)
2. Hand sanitizer will be available at both entrance and exit locations.
3. Potentially having your forehead temperature taken before entry.
4. Ushers will direct traffic flow and provide instructions and reinforce guidelines.
5. Standing and sitting at least 6 feet from others not in one's household.
6. No administration of Holy Communion at the present time.
7. No choir or congregational singing. Solo singing only.
8. Required reservations for attending services.
9. Avoiding crowded hallways.
10. Use of wipes on door handles and other surfaces, especially before and after bathroom use (the church will provide).
11. No prayer books will be provided for use at services.
12. Service bulletins will be provided & must be taken home. Do not leave them at church.
13. If you are sick, or don't feel well...stay home!
14. Any person who has traveled out of state is to avoid attending in-person services for a period of fourteen (14) days after returning home.

[October 1, 2020] Thousands of racial justice and healing leaders and practitioners across The Episcopal Church gathered to build community, craft strategy and equip each other for action during a series of “Becoming Beloved Community NOW” online gatherings at the end of July 2020. These webinars are now available for viewing [here](#).

Convened by the Presiding Officers’ Advisory Group on Beloved Community Implementation, the three gatherings focused on three urgent themes:

- Truth - Telling the truth about participation in white supremacy and racial oppression.
- Justice - Changing racist systems, especially “criminal” justice and public health/COVID response.
- Healing - Breaking free of white supremacy via training and formation.

Presiding Bishop Michael Curry and President of the House of Deputies Gay Clark Jennings offered prayer and reflections throughout the sessions.

The three sessions featured presentations and panels, along with breakout groups where practitioners and leaders met and shared with each other. “These gatherings were even more inspiring and informative than we dared to hope,” said The Rev. Canon Stephanie Spellers, the presiding bishop’s canon for evangelism, reconciliation and creation care. “Episcopalians are facing our history, healing wounds, and engaging the long-term work to shift from being the church of white superiority to beloved community.”
