As I sit at my desk and think about what to share, I find it amazing that I am nearly through my second week here. The time seems to have been blown by wind! It seems to me the best way to begin is with some information about where I come from and some of my life history.

I grew up outside of Washington, D.C. in Maryland; I am the second child of four children. My siblings are Theresa, Tommy, and Mary. My siblings and I attended a Roman Catholic elementary school, St. Bernard's Parochial School through the eighth grade and attended public schools through high school.

My work life has been varied and mostly fun stuff; I worked at NASA Goddard Space Flight Center in Greenbelt, Maryland for eleven years, beginning in the mailroom, then in the Travel Office where I learned the United Airlines Apollo reservations system where I met many people such as Arthur C.
